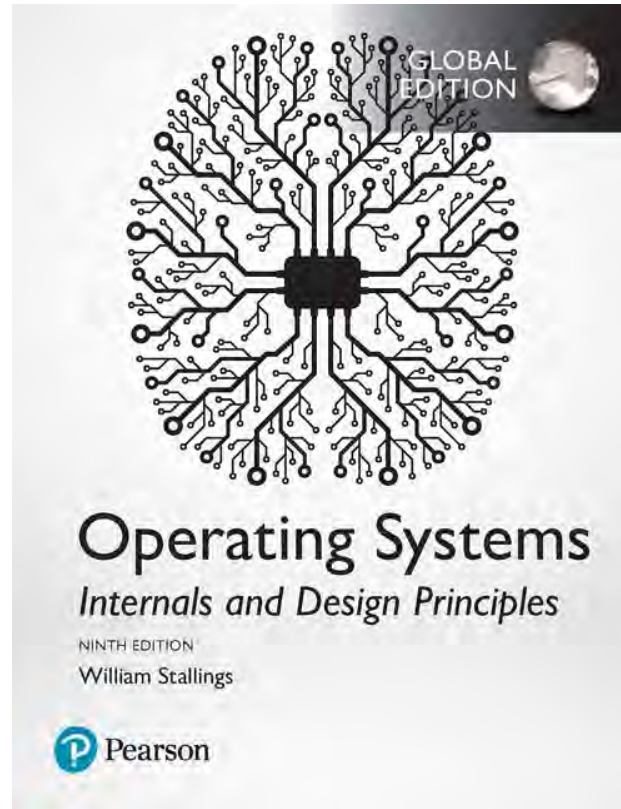
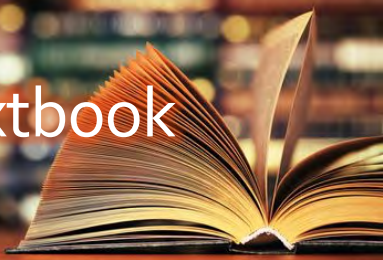

The Exam

- The exam is made up of two parts
 - A **written test** with open questions, closed questions, and exercises that is worth **20 points** (min 10 points to pass). Length: 120 min
 - **Lab tests** on using Linux system calls in C programs for a total of **12 points**

The final **grade** is the sum of the points in the two parts

- During the **semester** you can take the **written test** subdivided **into two parts**. one in November and one in January
 - 100 min for each part
 - 10 points (min 5 points to pass) on each part
- After the correction of the written test, you can ask for an oral exam to increase the grade
